




Panoramic view from Mystic Mountain



Mystic Mountain Hideaway

A quiet, peaceful place above Silicon Valley



Just minutes from downtown San Jose

Yet away from the hustle and bustle. Mystic Mountain Hideaway is one mile up Mt. Hamilton Road, in the eastern foothills.

Two Bedrooms

Each bedroom has a queen sized bed and dresser. There is also a large closet, plenty of extra linens, a vacuum, and iron. One window in the larger bedroom hides behind fifty-year-old grape vines.

Bath

The bathroom, between the two bedrooms features a large shower with hand-held shower head. There are towels a plenty for up to five guests. The original 1960 green formica counter has been replaced by a beautiful Italian vessel sink.

Living Room

The spacious living room includes a queen-sized futon with plenty of pillows for seating or sleeping.

The room also has a TV/VCR/DVD unit and we stock a few classic videos for you. An old Singer sewing machine serves as a computer desk with a high speed Ethernet connection for your laptop. We also provide Wi-Fi and some games and puzzles, including Ma Jong tiles. There is a dining area at one end of the living room.

Dining Area and Kitchen

The dining area features a table and four chairs. The kitchen is small but efficient. There are plenty of pots and pan, utensils, and serving pieces. There are dishes, plates, cups, and glasses. The refrigerator includes a frost free freezer. The microwave and toaster oven sit on a cart near the dining table.

We keep basic cooking supplies, such as salt, pepper, sugar, flour, tea, and coffee available, as well as some quick dinner supplies like pasta and spaghetti sauce. If you use any of the quick meal supplies, we expect you to replace them with something similar before you check out. Your room rate does not include food, but we understand that sometimes guests arrive late and hungry.

Other Amenities

Property includes a children's playhouse, play structure, organic garden, pool, labyrinth, and garden railroad. We expect children to be with adults at all times, especially near the pool or the play structure.
